Mayors on a Mission

From 8-11 March, Mayors and Councilors from Mornington, Burke, Etheridge and Carpentaria Shires participated in the annual Gulf delegation to meet Ministers and officials in Canberra and Brisbane. The delegation was organised by Gulf Savannah Development (GSD). A whole range of issues were on the agenda – from roads funding to exploring the options for better power supply. In total, the delegation met 18 Ministers/ MPs and also had a chance to talk to a Federal Policy Committee.

Apart from progressing specific issues, the value of these delegations includes making decision-makers aware of our issues and priorities, building relationships with key politicians and lifting the profile of the Gulf region.

A Regional Approach

We were congratulated on the Gulf's regional approach – where a group of Councils gets together and identifies regional projects and regional approaches. In our region, GSD is the vehicle for that regional collaboration. The best evidence

that this regional approach works is the funding received for the Einasleigh River Bridge last year – a project backed by 6 Gulf Councils.

Gulf Marine Park

We received a comprehensive briefing on the Federal Government's proposed marine conservation areas in the Gulf of Carpentaria and strongly expressed the view that consultation

needs to improve. Councils and GSD offered to facilitate this consultation to make sure we aren't kept in the dark.

Key points to note include:

- the areas being looked at are only in Commonwealth waters – 3km offshore
- a draft plan including proposed marine parks would be released later in 2010 at which time we currently have 90 days to make comment
- there would also be an opportunity down the track to comment on management plans.

A Better Power Supply

There is a lot of work going into

improving the region's power supply at present and we are holding a meeting in Burketown on Tuesday 25 May to discuss this – mark the date in your diary if you are interested. But the future seems green – renewable energy. The meeting is being co-hosted by Southern Gulf Catchments.

As all that are resident in the Shire know rain began falling in the week commencing 29 March as a result of the rain depression following the shearing off of ex TC Paul. As a result we had three rural evacuations, being Tirranna, Bowthorn and Escott. I must commend the pilots who undertook these evacuations, their skills and level headed approach ensured the safe carrying out of what was a difficult task. Escott (5 Mile) chose to self-evacuate due to the amount of water they could see coming through the catchment. There was no record of inundation into urban dwellings though some relocations took place due to the dwelling being surrounded by water.

During this time I contacted Escott, Beamesbrook (ringing regularly to ascertain their safety), Kingfisher Camp (also to ascertain the needs of Bowthorn as their phones were out), Brookdale, Westmoreland, Cliffdale and Yeldham in order to make sure that they were okay

and had no concerns re safety and evacuation.

I would take this opportunity to compliment Council officers, EMQ staff and others who were involved in the next 10 days or so of actions and activities. It was a great team effort and even under a lot of pressure these people responded in an efficient and timely manner to all emerging issues, often outside "normal" office hours. All Members of the Local Disaster Committee, Gregory SES, Burketown SES should be congratulated for their proactive stance and concerted effort to take issues forward and insistence for a desired, pre-determined outcome.

While the flood waters have receded we now face the enormous task of re-opening roads and returning life to normal in the Shire. Please bear with us as Council attempts to prioritise activities and gets to work on numerous sites around the Shire. Please feel free to call me should you have any personal concerns. Once again my thanks to all those involved in this event.

Message from the CEO



Well what an Easter the Shire has had! Rain, rain and more rain seemed to be the order of the day.

So wet in fact that the long awaited and eagerly anticipated Burketown Barramundi Fishing Competition had to be cancelled. What a difficult decision that would have been for the organising committee, yet it was the right decision. This will be our third declared event for the year. While Burketown itself got rather wet and flooded in the usual spots, there was an unusual turn of events to the north west of town.

Tirranna, Bowthorn and Escott were evacuated with flood waters in places they have not been before and the properties further west towards the territory border have suffered significant losses yet again. Fences, stock, roads and more have been destroyed, lost or damaged to a large extent.

Again along with our own officers and Councillors our thanks goes to Emergency Management Queensland Mount Isa office for their advice, assistance and follow-up. It's hard to begin to 'name names' without missing anyone out, but I would like to try and single out a few people for special mention.

At the time our Acting CEO John Brady

and our very own Director of Engineering Services, Dennis Kerr in conjunction with our Acting Mayor, Councillor Ernie Camp really kept the ship steering straight.

These three were well supported by many, but stand out examples of those who 'went the extra mile', in no particular order; are Norm Gowdy, Mike Johnston, Bob Marshall, Col Baker, Jenny Williams and Dave Marshall. Outside of our own organisation I would thank Elliot Dunn from EMQ, Cameron Barwick from Queensland Police, our own Burketown boys in blue, Trevor and Mark, staff from Nowlands who opened shop especially for the supply of what Avgas was at hand and the ever ready Di Phillips.

The local SES guys both here and in Gregory and other volunteers all played their parts in ensuring Burke Shire came out the other end of this as intact as possible.

I might jinx us but I think we have seen the last of re-supplies for this season. As I speak Dave Smith, Peter Cooling and Ringrose have all made it back into the Shire, opening grades are being re-done and the EMQ funded helicopter and pilot have left town.

As we head into cooler mornings I know Council will be doing everything it can to re-establish road networks, sort out damage to water infrastructure and move forward from this 'once in fifty years' event. Let's hope it is another 150 years before we see such inundation again.

Council Update

Community

- Council have made a submission to the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) for funding from Arts Queensland for funds to support the local RADF Program
- Council have applied for funding to run Seniors Week activities, awaiting the outcome.
- Council have received a \$30 000 grant from the Federal Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program to make improvements to the lighting at the Burketown Multi Purpose Courts. This will be matched by \$20 000 from Council.
- The Department of Environment and Natural Resource Management are considering Council's request to rename the township of Gregory Downs to Gregory. Community consultation by the Department is currently underway.
- Council have decided to host the Burke Shire Arts and Crafts show on a bi-annual basis. Effectively this means the Community Ball will take place in 2010, with the Arts and Crafts Show scheduled for 2011.
- Council have adopted a range of Quality Action Plans for the continued delivery of the Home and Community Care Program. The program is currently running at capacity.
- The Aquatic Facility (Swimming Pool) did sustain some damage to the pavement and sub-base areas adjacent to the Lap Pool, this is now fixed.
- Some vandalism has been reported with Toilet and BBQ facilities being targeted in the Morning Glory Park. In response to this until further notice the BBQ in Morning Glory Park has been shut down with a request to Council required for its use.

The Environment

- Council was successful in receiving a grant from The Low Carbon Diet Community Funding Program. Educational activities will be undertaken

with school children and a light bulb replacement program will be established for domestic residences.

The Road Network

- Council's engineering section for the past few months have been busy with various wet season activities, the major one being rehabilitating NDRRA Storm Damage and Flood Damage Emergent Works.
- This includes: opening grading on WDR 78A, pavement pot-holes on rural roads and town streets, and some specific wash-outs around culverts and bridges.
- Opening grades will continue on MR WDR 78A, MR 6801 Camooweal Road, Doomadgee Road East, Escott Road and Truganini Road as weather allows.

Services

- Town Water Supply infrastructure was damaged in the Easter 2010 event. Supply is currently being maintained by use of stand in pumps until new equipment can be purchased and installed.
- Local artist Pete Wilcox has been engaged by Council to supply a concept drawing for the addition of a sculptural element to the Morning Glory Park water feature.
- The Burketown Aerodromes lights were damaged in the Easter 2010 event. This is being attended to as a matter of urgency.

Events

- Planning is underway for the 2010 Order of the Outback Burke Shire Community Ball. The date set is Saturday July 3 2010. The theme may well be 'Glamour in the Gulf' ... Wait and see. The Ball Coordinator, Billy Henderson is working with an Advisory Group to bring the community a wonderful event.
- The Council once again coordinated Anzac Day memorial activities.

Administrative Matters

- Debbie Glyde has been appointed to Council in the role of Finance Manager.

- Tenders were called and received for Tyres and Batteries and Graders, with an excellent response to both. Assessment is underway.
- Council have enlisted the services of a land tenure Consultant to move forward on some outstanding issues, including the use of the Town Common, sporting reserves and the like.
- At the March and April Meetings, Councillors have reviewed the rural properties rating categories and are to make a decision at the May meeting with regards categories for 2010-11.
- Mayor, Councillor Annie Clarke is on approved leave until May 26 2010.

Economic Issues

- Council is contributing to the Northern Outback Development Forum. The forum was held at Normanton on May 5 2010. The forum was convened in response to the Northern Australia Task Force Land and Water report and the perceived need for the North to have a stronger voice in response to the issues threatening future growth. Councillors and the Director of Engineering Services attended.

Councillor Travel for Delegations, Meetings and Training

- The Deputy Mayor, Councillor Ernie Camp, currently Acting Mayor participated in the 2010 Gulf Savannah Development delegation to Canberra and Brisbane to meet with relevant Ministers and government representatives.
- Councillors attended the Developing Australia's North 2010 Forum.
- Councillor Forshaw attended the Australian Health Ministers' Advisory Council (AHMAC) Rural Health Standing Committee held in Townsville on March 9 2010.
- Councillors attended the North Queensland LGAQ conference in Normanton in May 2010.

Recent Flooding in Burke Shire

Acting Mayor Cr Ernie Camp acknowledged the patience and resilience of Burke Shire residents who are bouncing back well from record flooding that occurred over Easter 2010 last week.

Cr Camp praised the efforts of local people including the Local Disaster Management Group who had worked on recovery efforts throughout the Easter weekend and during the days since.

Cr Camp paid tribute to the State

Government's support, especially that rendered by Emergency Management Queensland (EMQ). He also applauded the statement by Bruce Grady, Acting Chief Officer of EMQ that his agency sought to collaborate with Council in offering all affected residents of the Shire a hand up.

"It has been comforting to know that at every stage we have been able to rely on EMQ. They have provided a range of assistance

including the deployment of helicopters, arranging specialist tradesmen and co-ordinating recovery arrangements," Councillor Camp said.

Cr Camp recognised the assistance of other State Departments as well, in particular the Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation, Department of Main Roads and Queensland Police. He also offered thanks to local State

member Betty Kiernan for her support and assistance and welcomed her appointment as Parliamentary Secretary for Emergency Services.

"The Premier's activation of Natural Disaster Relief Recovery arrangements has given us a solid basis for hope that the significant recovery and re-construction work that is needed after the floods will be achieved" Cr Camp added

ANZAC Day We remember

As the first light of dawn appeared over the horizon on Sunday 25 April, Anzac Day, you could hear the haunting sounds of the 'Last Post' wafting over the community that were gathered at the Burke Shire Cenotaph to show their respects to those soldiers that fought and died for our country.

For those who have never been to a Dawn Service is hard to describe the feelings and the compassion it evokes when the bugle plays the first notes of the 'Last Post'. The attendance in this years service has increased in numbers which states that the Anzac spirit is well and truly alive and the words "Lest We Forget" means as much today as it did 80 years ago.

As Burke Shire has no RSL, Council strives to fill that role on Anzac Day providing a venue where Diggers, descendants and relatives of Soldiers, and the general public can commemorate Anzac Day together. As part of this commitment, Council provided a free breakfast and free BBQ lunch to all who attended the services.

Acting Mayor Ernie Camp, officiated over the services, welcoming the public and introducing our narrators of the 'Ode'. Tyrone Cooling (Burketown School) for the Dawn Service and Adrienne Brady (Gregory School) read the 'Ode' in the morning service.

Four representatives of Delta Company 51, Far North Queensland Regiment attended the services lending an officialdom to the ceremonies. Three soldiers performed the Guard of Honor and Staff Officer, Pat Breen marched alongside the parade and read the Role of Honor.

Pastor Doug Jones led us in the Lords prayer and Denis Kerr recited the poem 'My Brother George' written by our own Vi Huxley about her brother George Smith from Brookdale Station.

At the march we had representation from Diggers, Descendants of Soldiers, School of the Air, Burketown School, Gregory School, Scouts, CWA, SES, Police and the Church. The Community played their part as they do every year and volunteered their services doing the cooking, preparation and setting up and packing away. Thank you to all those volunteers that helped to make this such a memorable day.





Small businesses urged to get online or get left behind!

Great opportunities await Gulf and Tablelands businesses wanting to 'get on-line' this year, thanks to a 'Small Business On-Line' project being offered by the Gulf and Tablelands Small Business Service.

The 'Small Business On-Line' project will allow small businesses in the Gulf and Tablelands to receive training and get individualised support to develop websites, or to develop email marketing or e-commerce activities.

"This is a great opportunity for the small business community in the Gulf and Tablelands" said Gulf Savannah Development (GSD) CEO, Rob Macalister. "The ability of the internet to promote your products and keep in touch with your customers is particularly relevant to businesses in regional and remote areas" he added.

A survey undertaken by GSD last year showed that only 19% of small

businesses in the Gulf had websites and only 4% were doing sales over the internet. In addition, only one Gulf business had an email newsletter to keep in touch with customers.

The 'Small Business On-Line' project kicks off with a series of free workshops to be held in Burketown, Karumba, Mt Surprise, Atherton, Malanda, Mareeba and Chillagoe. These 2-hour workshops include topics aimed at those without much experience of e-business, such as 'Why Go On-Line', and more advanced topics, such as 'Rank #1 on Google'. There is also a 'Tourism Marketing On-Line' workshop aimed at the special needs of the tourism industry. These face-to-face workshops will be followed up by 'on-line workshops', 'webinars' and an IT Expo later in the year.

"In addition to the workshops, eligible businesses can also get up

to six hours of free individualised support from our expert panel" added Mr Macalister. "This individualised support is only available to businesses who have attended a workshop. We are anticipating high demand for these services and it will be allocated on a first-in, first served basis from small businesses located in one of the following Shires: Tablelands, Etheridge, Carpentaria, Burke, Mornington, Doomadgee" he added.

"Our workshop presenters are all committed to supporting the small business community in the north and include Nicky Jurd of cityofcairns.com, Robert Rutten of RuttenTech and Jeanette Sturiale, a Mareeba based email marketing specialist. We also thank businesses including SkyTrans Airlines and Telstra who have come on-board to help deliver the program" said Mr Macalister.

The Gulf and Tablelands Small Business Service was established in 2009 as a partnership between Gulf Savannah Development and Tablelands Futures Corporation (TFC). Savannah Way Limited has joined GSD and TFC to help deliver the 'Small Business On-Line' project, which is an Australian Government funded initiative.

In addition to the 'Small Business On-Line' project, the Gulf and Tablelands Small Business Service will continue to provide the services of its experienced small business officer, Ms Sue Fairley, and low-cost access to legal, financial and other specialised advice.

Stained Glass And Copperfoil Workshop




